On March 15, 1994, the Cancer Assistance Program of Mount Hamilton and District was officially incorporated to provide: "The provision of non-clinical information, educational materials, dressings and other patient supplies, transportation, loan equipment, fellowship and emotional support to persons afflicted with cancer and other serious illnesses."

2019 has been a year of reflection and celebration, but also a year of continued growth. Since moving into our larger space at 555 Concession St., we have experienced increases in all our services. A total of 1,134 new clients registered for services in 2019, and on average 25 clients walked through our doors daily. With the continued growth, we welcomed 36 new engaged volunteers who are supporting us in client services, the equipment shop, on special event committees, and in Drive & Ride. Every day we rely on our volunteers and could not deliver services without them...THANK YOU!



A 25 YEAR LEGACY

"Twenty years from now you will be more disappointed from the things you didn't do than by the ones you did do. So throw off the bowlines. Sail away from the safe harbor. Catch the trade winds in your sails.

Explore. Dream. Discover." ~ Mark Twain

In our case it was twenty-five years ago that a small but mighty group of volunteers dreamt big, took a risk, and created a presence on Hamilton mountain to provide cancer patients and their families with much needed supports as they managed their cancer diagnosis. With only seven registered clients in our first year, to twenty-two new clients registering on a weekly basis today, the dream of these dedicated men and women has become a reality that has gone well beyond their expectations.

In 1994, the Canadian Cancer Society (CCS) decided to amalgamate their offices and move out of their Hamilton mountain location. Thinking such a move was an unthinkable situation for cancer patients and their families, a small but hugely committed group of volunteers began a process that today is a legacy of goodwill, kindness, and compassion. With a grant from the New Horizon's Program, these men and women, within a short but very busy year, established the Cancer Assistance Program (CAP). How fitting it was that their opening was celebrated with the Mountain News headline, "Mountain Cancer Group Wearing a New CAP."

Similar to today, the services offered then were free and practical in nature. Equipment was offered to cancer patients to help them safely return home from treatment. Education in the area of cancer prevention was shared with young and old. Drives were provided to and from cancer appointments. With the dedication of many volunteers, CAP's service to the community grew such that over the course of twenty-five years, CAP had to move four times – each time to a bigger and better location for serving clients.

It takes a village to raise a child, and it took a village to make us who we are today. Like today, the CAP of vesterday relied on the generosity of the community who attended an unprecedented number of events (almost one a month!), all organized by volunteers. Events included Moving Mountains, Hike the Rail Trail, Presidents' and Principals' Bowl, a yearly celebration of all things cultural called Musical Mosaic, a spaghetti supper, St. Patrick's Day bowling party, Mountain Plaza Mall bazaars, flower sales and an annual golf tournament that still continues today. Communications to all who came to be touched by CAP was via a monthly newsletter, the CAPsule. It shouldn't surprise us to know that the newsletter was printed in black and white and then coloured by volunteers to save money. However, this was also a monthly excuse for some fellowship, for the colouring started with tea and cookies, was interrupted by lunch, and ended with more tea and cookies.

So many of the volunteers who joined CAP during its early years are still part of our large number of active volunteers who are the backbone of "A Small Organization with a Big Job and a Caring Heart." While volunteers no longer colour our newsletters by hand, they remain on the front lines of the organization, providing direct service to our clients. They are the friendly face that greets family and clients at the front desk ensuring they receive the supports they need. They drive our clients to appointments, repair and sanitize equipment, volunteer at events, send cards to clients, update files and organize fundraising activities. Our volunteers not only help to keep our lights on, but ensure our services are running smoothly.

Over the past twenty-five years, we have grown to meet the needs of cancer patients in our community. In 2019, we loaned out 3,022 pieces of equipment. We provided 3,196 six-packs of nutritional supplements and 2,729 packages of incontinence products. We provided just over 2,300 parking spots for appointments at the Juravinski Cancer Centre and Hospital, along with 11,053 rides to and from cancer-related appointments. Our volunteers dedicated over 21,000 hours of their time delivering services or engaging in fundraising activities. All of this with the common goal of ensuring we are able meet the demand for the practical and free supports that formed the nucleus of the Cancer Assistance Program twenty-five years ago, and is still the focus of our service to the community today.

Andy Rooney once said, "Everyone wants to live on the mountain, but all the happiness and growth occurs while you are climbing it." The volunteers that made our home on the mountain possible are a true testament to the fact that happiness and growth comes from the journey, not the endgame. A cancer diagnosis continues to be a reality for so many in our community. As long as the need is there, the Cancer Assistance Program will continue to climb to meet that need by offering the free and practical supports that began our legacy twenty-five years ago.

Thank you to the many volunteers who have helped build CAP's reputation as an essential partner in the healthcare community. Since our doors first opened in 1994, CAP continues to be there by providing 'Help when you really need it.'


