# 2023 - The Importance of **Connection & Kindness**

Three years ago, we were facing a very different spring. The uncertainty and disbelief, that in 2020, a world wide pandemic could occur was just too much for many to fathom. The feelings conjured by this virus were for many, similar to those that cancer patients and their families feel when they learn of their cancer diagnosis.

Since 2020, our community has changed. We are experiencing more random acts of kindness through our shared experiences and feelings. Covid and the regulated safety protocols heightened our awareness of feelings of isolation and once lifted the feelings of joy and kindness when connecting with people, whether at work, in our neighbourhoods, and with family and friends was a welcome change.
