MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR:



A Look to Tomorrow

With the month of December already here, it signals that another year is quickly coming to a close. For 30 years, the Cancer Assistance Program (CAP) has

provided practical and essential free services, supporting cancer patients in our community to live at home while navigating their cancer journey. Today, with over 4,500 clients, the need is not going away. In fact, the demand for critical support is greater than ever.

In 2024, an estimated 247,100 Canadians will learn they have cancer. That's approximately 8,000 more diagnoses than in 2023. As the number of people impacted by cancer continues to grow, so does the urgent need for support services for individuals and families facing the emotional and physical barriers that come with a diagnosis.

With 30 new registrants every week, we've seen a 12% increase in new clients from 2023, making it impossible for us to meet the needs of every individual who turns to us for support.

This year our incredible team of volunteer drivers completed 9,497 trips, a 40% increase over 2023. In July alone, they made an average of 80 one-way trips per day, peaking at 112. However, we're currently experiencing an unprecedented waitlist, meaning that on some days we're unable to meet the growing demand for our services.

I would like to extend my sincere gratitude to the over 160 volunteers who every day go beyond the call to do what they can to meet this demand. To the Board of Directors, the staff, and our healthcare partners, thank you for the hours spent strategically looking at new and innovative ways that we can align our services to better meet this demand.

To you our donors, thank you for your support. Every dollar does make an impact and in the attached letter, you will read comments from our cancer clients and their caregivers on how your support has made a difference.

As 2024 comes to an end, let us remind ourselves, that for 30 years, CAP has been meeting the practical demands of cancer patients and their families. We are committed for the next 30 years and beyond to finding solutions to not only meet the demand but grow services. We can't do it alone but know that through the support of our donors, our clients and our volunteers, we continue to play a valuable part in the cancer circle of care.

When the clock strikes midnight on December 31st, I ask that you take a moment to reflect on the past year and the gifts you have shared. Whether a financial gift or the gift of volunteering your time, I ask that you make a commitment to continue to support the needs of cancer patients and their families. It will be the best new year's resolution that you can make!

On behalf of the staff at the Cancer Assistance Program, we wish you and your family, a safe and happy holiday season and the very best in 2025.
